Palmdale Water District Redistricting Process Frequently Asked Questions

Every ten years, local governments use new census data to redraw their district lines to reflect how local populations have changed. Federal and state law requires Special Districts to engage communities in the redistricting process by holding public hearings and/or workshops and doing public outreach, including to non- English-speaking communities.

What is redistricting?

Every ten years, districts must be redrawn so that each district is substantially equal in population. This process, called redistricting, is important in ensuring that each board member represents about the same number of constituents. In the Palmdale Water District, the Board of Directors is responsible for drawing board member districts. Redistricting is done using U.S. Census data, which was released in August, 2021. For the Palmdale Water District, the redistricting process must be completed by April 17, 2022.

Why does redistricting matter to me?

Redistricting determines which neighborhoods and communities are grouped together into a district for purposes of electing a board member.

The Board of Directors will seek input in selecting the next district map for our board members. You have an opportunity to share with the Board of Directors how you think district boundaries should be drawn to best represent your community.

What do the existing board member districts look like?

You can find a map of the District's current board member districts here.

What criteria will our Board of Directors use when drawing district lines?

To the extent practicable, district lines will be adopted using the following criteria: (1) geographically contiguous districts, (2) the geographic integrity of local neighborhoods or communities shall be respected in a manner that minimizes its division, (3) geographic integrity of a city shall be respected in a manner that minimizes its division, (4) easily identifiable boundaries that follow natural or artificial barriers (rivers, streets, highways, rail lines, etc.), and (5) lines shall be drawn to encourage geographic compactness. In addition, boundaries shall not be drawn for purposes of favoring or discriminating against a political party.

How will our Board of Directors notify the public about redistricting?

The Board of Directors will reach out to local media to publicize the redistricting process. Also, we will make a good faith effort to notify community groups of various kinds about the redistricting process. Our public workshop and public input hearings will be provided in applicable languages (e.g., Spanish) if residents submit a request in advance. The Board of Directors will notify the public about the redistricting public workshop and public input hearings, post maps online before adoption, and create a dedicated web page for all relevant information about the redistricting process.

How can I get involved?

Input from the public is critical to help inform the Board of Directors about your Community of Interest. The Palmdale Water District has prepared this Public Comment Form to provide the public with a way of submitting information on characteristics that may define your Community of Interest.

The concept of protecting Communities of Interest is to draw boundaries in a manner that preserves communities that share common interests and that should be included within a single district for purposes of their effective and fair representation. There are many types of common interests that may identify a Community of Interest. For example, communities may be defined by the location of geographic boundaries or features, such as a housing subdivision, parks, lakes, mountains or freeways. Communities may share a common culture or language. Communities may be defined by their neighborhood, or by the location of cultural, religious or educational institutions. Certain public services, like public schools and public transit may also help define a community.

If you would like the Board of Directors to consider a particular Community of Interest, we invite you to complete and submit a Public Comment Form, to speak at a public hearing or to submit your written comments to the District. All personal information listed on this form is **voluntary** and will become a part of the Palmdale Water District's public record. The public is not required to fill out all of the questions below, but the more information the District gathers, the better informed the process of redrawing Board of Director district boundaries will be.

Overview of Redistricting Laws

- General Principle: Board of Director Divisions must be substantially equal in population
 - U.S. Constitution's Equal Protection Clause and "One-Person, One-Vote" Jurisprudence
 - California Elections Code Section 21621 ("substantially equal" in "total population" as required by the U.S. Constitution)



- Make good faith effort to draw districts with equal population
- Exact equality is not required for local districts if deviation is justified by legitimate state purposes
- Deviation of less that 10 percent is presumptively valid
 - Only if for legitimate reasons
 - Deviations should be explained on traditional redistricting criteria of other lawful justifications
 - Legal Authorities –U.S. Constitution, Supreme Court Case Law including Reynolds v. Sims, Gaffney v. Cummings, Larios v. Cox, Harris v. Arizona Independent Redistricting Commission



- Deviations from equal population should be justified
 - Show consistent reliance on traditional redistricting criteria (e.g., respecting neighborhoods and communities of interest, observing natural and other boundaries, maintaining compact districts)
- Do not seek to disadvantage any particular group
- Show good faith effort



- Measuring Population Equality and Deviation
 - Start with District's total population
 - 126,994
 - Determine ideal equal population of the 5 Board of Director Divisions
 - 25,399
 - Determine percent deviation from ideal of each district
 - Determine total percent deviation difference between the districts with the greatest positive and negative percent deviations

Traditional Redistricting Criteria

- Focus on traditional redistricting criteria
 - Contiguity
 - Compactness
 - Natural Boundaries and Streets
 - Neighborhood and Communities of Interest

Legal Authorities – Case Law, California Constitution Article XXI, Section
 2; California Elections Code Section 21621



Traditional Redistricting Criteria

- Contiguity all parts of district should connect
- Compactness district should be geographically compact
 - Many ways to measure compactness
 - Be aware of appearance, shape, and border lines
- Existing boundaries observe existing boundaries
 - Geographic, topographic boundaries
 - Streets, Freeways
 - Other Boundaries



Traditional Redistricting Criteria

- Neighborhoods and Communities of Interest preserve communities sharing common interests
 - Neighborhoods
 - Example of Common Interests
 - Land Use patterns (residential, industrial, commercial)
 - Cultural and Language characteristics
 - Income Level
 - Educational Background; Employment and Economic patterns
 - Crime, schools, other common issues
 - Obtain public testimony and consider census data, City neighborhood information, planning information, etc.



Equal Protection Clause

- 14th Amendment's Equal Protection Clause prohibits the use of race as the predominant factor in redistricting except in narrow cases
 - race generally cannot be "predominant" factor
 - i.e., no racial gerrymandering
 - Legal Authorities U.S. Constitution; Supreme Court Case law including Shaw v. Reno, Miller v. Johnson, Bush v. Vera, Cromartie I & II, Alabama Legislative Black Caucus, Cooper v. Harris, Bethune-Hill



Equal Protection Clause

- 14th Amendment's Equal Protection Clause does not, however, prohibit all consideration of race
- May consider race as a factor along with traditional race-neutral redistricting criteria
- Consideration of traditional criteria should not be subordinated to consideration of race and should be contemporaneous



Equal Protection Clause

- Evidence of race as a predominant factor:
 - Direct testimony
 - Circumstantial evidence (demographics, shape, changes, process, public record)
- If race determined to be predominant factor, strict scrutiny applies to redistricting plan
 - Need compelling state interest
 - Plan must be narrowly tailored
 - High burden




Federal Voting Rights Act

- Section 2 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965
 - Prohibits any voting practice or procedure that "results in a denial or abridgement" of the right to vote based on race, color, or language minority status
 - Applies to prohibit redistricting plans that result in "vote dilution" by depriving minority voters of an equal opportunity to elect a candidate of their choice
 - i.e., must not unlawfully minimize or cancel minority voting strength
 - Discriminatory effect sufficient, discriminatory intent not required




Federal Voting Rights Act

- Examples of "Vote Dilution"
 - Fracturing dispersing minority voters into several different districts such that a bloc-voting majority can routinely outvote them



 Packing – concentrating minority voters into a small number of districts and thereby minimizing their influence in other districts





Federal Voting Rights Act

- The Supreme Court has set three preconditions to Section 2 liability under the federal VRA (the "Gingles" criteria)
 - The minority group must be sufficiently large and geographically compact to constitute a majority in a district
 - The minority group must be politically cohesive; and
 - The majority votes sufficiently as a bloc to enable it usually to defeat the minority's preferred candidate
 - Legal Authorities Section 2 of the Voting Rights Act; Thornburg v. Gingles



Summary of Law and Criteria

- Key Principles to Keep in Mind
 - Strive for Population Equality
 - Make a good faith effort to draw districts equal in population
 - Justify any deviations with use of traditional redistricting criteria
 - Focus on Traditional Redistricting Criteria
 - Draw contiguous and compact districts
 - Respect boundaries, neighborhoods, and communities of interest
 - Obtain public testimony, neighborhood/community information, and make a good record
 - Do not Use Race as the Predominant Factor
 - Focus on traditional race-neutral criteria
 - Comply with the Voting Rights Act
 - Avoid fracturing or packing minority voters
 - Establish and Follow a Good Process




California Drought Status



California Drought Status Snow Pack


California Snow Water Content, January 3, 2022, Percent of April 1 Average







Water Conservation-Update



Production Comparison: 1st and 2nd Halves of 2020 and 2021





Staff recommends that the Board approve and authorize the General Manager to execute a contract with Zim Industries, Inc. (dba Bakersfield Well and Pump Co.) for well drilling services for Well No. 36 (new well) in a not-to exceed amount of \$2,073,913.00.

Alternative Options:

There is no alternative option.

Impact of Taking No Action:

The District would benefit from drilling a new groundwater producing well. The impact of taking no action would result in not adding a new groundwater well to the water system.

Background:

To supply existing production facilities, staff proposed to design, drill, and equip an approximately 2,000 GPM municipal well. Therefore, staff accepted bids from qualified contractors for drilling, constructing, development, and testing of one (1) new potable water supply well, designated as Well 36.

Staff received three qualified bids from Zim Industries, Inc dba Bakersfield Well & Pump Company, South West Pump & Drilling, Inc., and Layne Christensen Company. All bids were evaluated and scored based on the requirements set forth in the bid documents. Zim Industries, Inc dba Bakersfield Well & Pump Company was selected based on their experience, availability, and low proposed fee to complete the work requested by the District.

The total bid price in the bid proposal submitted by Zim Industries, Inc dba Bakersfield Well & Pump Company is \$2,073,913.00. A bidder's bond in the amount of 10 percent of the total bid price was submitted with the bid proposal. The surety company providing the bid bond is Everest Reinsurance Company.

The criterion for responsibility pertains to whether the bidder is regularly engaged in this type of work and whether they can perform the work satisfactorily as promised. The contractor is required to provide payment and performance bonds to protect the District's interest.

Zim Industries, Inc. dba Bakersfield Well and Pump Co. as the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, holds a valid worker's compensation insurance policy (Policy number WC831166116) with American Zurich Insurance Company effective from March 1, 2019 to March 1, 2022.

The contractor's past performance record has been utilized to evaluate the general competency of the contractor for the performance of the work. To demonstrate the bidder's capability and experience of having completed similar projects successfully, the bid documents require that the contractor submit a list of all projects completed by the contractor during the last three years involving work of similar type and complexity and comparable value.

It is required that no less than 60 percent of the work be performed by the contractor's own forces without subcontracting. It appears that Zim Industries, Inc. dba Bakersfield Well and Pump Co. will perform 100 percent of the work and meets the limitations on the subcontracting work.

Responsiveness of the bid pertaining to compliance with the material terms of the bid documents has been reviewed and deemed acceptable.



Workshop A: Solving the Affordability Riddle: Creating a Framework for Customer Assistance Programs that Bridge Legal Barriers and are Financially Sound

Monday, February 21, 2022 8:30 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.

Customer Assistance Programs (CAPs) are fraught with real and perceived barriers, but there is a better way. CAPs can be used to harness and align your customer services with the need in your community in a way that surmounts legal barriers and appreciates the full costs and financial benefits each CAP provides. Learn the tools and the techniques from leading utilities of all sizes to start or enhance your customer assistance and affordability efforts. As part of this session participants will work on developing a CAP framework that provides guidance in terms of qualification thresholds as well as levels of assistance and be introduced to a tool that helps utilities rank assistance programming based on new financial impacts or consequence of a range of options.

Consistent with that over-arching intent, we have identified an opportunity to develop a business case framework for rate funded customer assistance programs (CAPs) that would address perceived or real legal barriers. The objective is to identify a fundamentally sound way to comprehensively evaluate various CAPs with an appreciation of the full costs and financial benefits each would provide. In so doing, utilities would have the ability to select and design CAPs that address legal concerns (including those stemming state statutes, case law, and/or bond covenants) and provide a neutral or positive financial benefit that would support funding from rates. The framework would serve to provide guidance to utilities in terms of qualification thresholds as well as levels of assistance as utilities would now have a clear understanding of the net financial impacts or consequences of a range of options.

Learning Objectives:

- · Learn the basis for CAP needs to justify the program for their utility;
- Evaluate the broad range of CAP options available and select those that might work best for a utility's affordability needs;
- Interact with a CAP framework to learn to identify potential barriers and how to overcome them; and
- Create the beginnings of a CAP framework that is specific to their utility.

Workshop B: Communicating to Decision Makers: Getting Your Staff To Understand

Monday, February 21, 2022 8:30 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.

The burden of effective communication is on the sender, not the receiver. Unfortunately, most of our junior- and mid-level staff are poorly equipped to be good communicators. There are many textbooks and guidance documents that highlight the importance of better communication

but there is limited practical guidance provided. Technical professionals frequently cite communicating with decision makers as the most difficult part of their job. This workshop will explore what decision makers can do to mold their staff into better communicators. Developing a staff of effective trusted advisors to executive teams and decision makers requires more than standard marketing training or communications webinars. Workshop participants will leave with a checklist of practical action items that they can take home to implement with their staff. More importantly, workshop attendees with be provided with a solid understanding of 'where to start' and milestone tips and pointers for measuring improvement. The workshop will be facilitated by three, 30-year-plus veterans of the water and wastewater industry and by a 30-year-plus technical leader from outside the profession to get an outside view.

This interactive workshop will include case examples from presenters, breakout discussion groups, and the use of an audience response system to get immediate feedback from attendees to drive larger discussions.

Terms such as 'digital transformation', 'smart utility', 'digital water', 'intelligent water' have been the buzzwords that we heard quite often and of interest to water utilities who have either planned and/or contemplated to digitally transform their utilities towards enterprise excellence. Over the years, the concept of digital transformation evolved from simple digitization (paper to electronic), to digitalization (manual to automated) of business processes to improve efficiency utility resources and knowledge management. Water Research Foundation (WRF) Project 5039 "Definition of Smart Utility: How to be a Digital Utility and the Framework for an Intelligent Water System (IWS)" has been tasked to develop such a framework to define and develop the various elements of an intelligent/smart/digital water utility. In order to help utilities, plan their digital transformation efforts, the project has also developed a web-based intuitive tool to assess the digital maturity of the business processes of utilities.

Workshop E: Workforce Development - Developing the Whole Person: A Tactical View for Workforce Competency

Monday, February 21, 2022 1:30 p.m. - 5:00 p.m.

Nearly 1/3 of the U.S. Workforce is age 55 or older (30%), which means 47.7 million people will likely retire within the next 10-15 years. The loss of such a large section of the working population creates a significant gap in U.S. Industry, and requires immediate steps to ensure a well-trained and capable workforce is ready to fill the gap. This interactive workshop looks at the

current training and development approaches within the water and water reclamation utilities which seek to fill the gap of the departing workforce. Many utilities have begun developing training programs that address the 'Whole Person', and provide a holistic approach to competencies and skills development. The workshop activities takes an in-depth look at the organizational strategies, business requirements, and personnel needs that are required for effective employee progression, retention, and succession planning. These training programs support project management objectives, program administration, policy enforcement, effective coaching, mentoring, disciplining techniques, as well as effective writing, developing and presenting in front of small and large groups, and understanding and executing budgetary oversight. The workshop looks at the needs of the 'Whole Person' and explores training programs within the water sector that seek to meet these development needs. This workshop is the continuation of a workshop presented at WEFTEC 2021, called 'Workforce Development-Addressing the Whole Person - A Holistic Approach to Skills and Competency Development,' and this workshop focuses on the Tactical View for Competency Development.

Learning Objectives:

- · Gain a better understanding of the meaning of "Technical and Leadership skills";
- Discuss the concepts and attributes of a learning organization, one that supports a wellrounded workforce in all water and wastewater areas including field services, engineering, plant operations and maintenance, and construction management;
- Identify resources available to assist in developing a "holistic" training program that addresses staff needs and meets the needs of future progression within the organization;
- Identify programs that enable employees to gain increased knowledge and high-value skills without waiting for vacancies to create promotional opportunities.

Workshop F: Combining Traditional SCADA with Contemporary Analytics: Big Data Finally Yields Big Benefits

Monday, February 21, 2022 1:30 p.m. - 5:00 p.m.

SCADA datasets represent one of, if not the largest, inventory of existing data available to utilities. Millions of datapoints are available that tell the story of operations at utility facilities going back years. Furthermore, these datasets are usually of very high quality as the data has not been touched by human hands. These factors combine to create what is probably the best opportunity for the application of advanced analytics, artificial intelligence (AI) and machine learning (ML).

Traditional reporting and analysis tools provided by SCADA vendors have not kept pace for a number of reasons. Vendor, and more importantly the inability of such products to be leveraged outside of the SCADA environment (i.e., economies of scale) mean that such vendor tools will have difficulty keeping up with the capabilities of general-purpose systems.

Advances in these general-purpose analytic tools, represented by products such as PowerBi and Tableau, have been game-changers. These tools can now be used to combine SCADA with other external data sources – i.e., weather – to create even more value. Their affordability,

feature set and ability to handle very large datasets presents utilities with a new opportunity – to finally get the most out of their biggest data set.

Learning Objectives:

- Achieve a better understanding of the tools and techniques needed using and manipulating large SCADA data sources for the purpose of analytics;
- Share lessons learned through the discussion of three recent utility analytics projects that used big SCADA data;
- Identify a number of your own key questions that might be answered by combining your SCADA data with contemporary business intelligence tools like PowerBI.

Workshop G: A Practical and Concise Approach to Developing an Effective Strategic Asset Management Plan

Monday, February 21, 2022 1:30 p.m. - 5:00 p.m.

Asset management continues to mature as a discipline that helps ensure our water industry optimizes the value of our assets. This is an especially critical area for such an asset intensive industry as ours, and a time when the optimization of our resources is so desperately needed. Effective Asset Management Programs require a sound and effective strategy to achieve budget optimization while providing high quality service. In many instances, strategy is postponed in favor of tactical work, but is necessary to sustain an effective asset management program. This workshop will walk the audience through the development of an effective (i.e., realistic and aligned with organization goals) strategic asset management plan (SAMP) and demonstrate the importance of this element to the success of asset management practices. Outcomes will include applicable examples crafted through an interactive learning experience, addressing how to build core components.

A growing number of utility leaders across all sizes of systems are finding that you can achieve more, positively impact natural resources, and improve financial stability through incorporation of intelligent water. With increasing case studies illustrating the significant return on investment the technology can provide, utilities are increasingly considering and adopting, at least in some part, digital solutions to their address their challenges and achieve their priorities. The pandemic catalyzed this change as utilities were forced to find innovative and transformative approaches, resulting in rapid deployment of new technologies and meaningful business process improvements.

One of the topics with rapidly growing interest is digital twins. While the concept of digital twins is not new, the application and adoption of digital twins in the water sector is only beginning and will continue to evolve and play an integral long-term role in water utilities' planning, engineering, modeling, design, and operations.

Webinar: Sexual Harassment Prevention for Non-Supervisors

Presenter: Rebecca Green, Richards, Watson, Gershon

Under Senate Bill 1343, passed in 2018, California employers with five or more employees must provide at least 1 hour of training and education regarding sexual harassment, abusive conduct and harassment based on gender to all employees within 6 months of their assuming their role, and every 2 years after. This training must be provided by January. 1, 2021.

SB 1343 also includes temporary and seasonal employees, who must be trained within 30 days of their hiring or 100 hours worked, whichever is first. This training must be consistent with what is provided to other employees. The requirement for seasonal and temporary workers began on January 1, 2020.

This training, via webinar, will satisfy SB 1343 requirements. The webinar is interactive, allowing attendees to ask questions.






T1: San Antonio River Tunnel & Flood Management Tour

Tuesday, June 14 8:00 am - 12:00 noon

Tour Location: Olmos Dam, Flood Tunnel Inlet, Nueva Street

flood gates and Tunnel Outlet

Tour Cost: \$60 Max Attendance: 25



This will be a tour of the San Antonio River Flood Tunnel and Flood Management facilities. We will begin the tour at the Olmos Dam which is 49 feet high at the crest and 1,941 feet long. The gate encompasses 6 gates used to release water during flood events.

Next, we will visit the Flood Tunnel Inlet. The tunnel is 24 feet in diameter, 150 feet below the City of San Antonio and runs 3.2 miles towards south of town. At the inlet you will be able to see the trash racks used, 5 recirculation pumps, and 24-foot diameter tunnel inlet.

Next, we will visit Nueva Street flood gates, which provide more flood management in the downtown area. We will end the tour at the tunnel outlet where you can see the recirculation system to keep water pumping through the system back to downtown during drought conditions.



T2: Clouse Water Recycling Center

Tour Location: Steven M. Clouse Water Recycling Center

Find out what happens "after the flush" as you investigate the path wastewater takes through San Antonio's largest water recycling center, with an average day capacity of 125 million gallons per day. Participants follow the flow of wastewater through the Steven M. Clouse Water Recycling Center, getting off the bus at key locations for a closer look (and smell!) of the water recycling process.

The plant, commissioned in 1987, is home to centralized biosolids processing operations for the entire system, a state-of-theart biogas to energy facility, and supplies the eastern leg of the largest direct recycled water delivery system in the nation.



T3: H2Oaks Center

The San Antonio Water System's H2Oaks Center can provide almost 1/3 of the water supply for the city's 1.9 million customers with three water supplies, all operated from the H2Oaks control room: desalinated water, Edwards Aquifer water stored using aquifer storage and recovery, and treated Carrizo Aquifer water.

All three water supplies are combined in clearwells prior to distribution to the east and west reaches of the complex water distribution system. This tour includes a presentation on San Antonio's many water sources and a tour of a state-of-the-art desalination plant.

T4: AT&T Lock & Dam on Museum Reach

Tour Location: San antonio River along the Museum Reach

Tour Cost: \$70 Max Attendance: 20



This will be a tour of the improvements made to the San Antonio River along the Museum Reach. Spanning the length of a bridge, the structure links a 1.3 mile section of the Riverwalk to the historic VFW Post 76, the San Antonio Museum of Art and the Pearl Brewery. The San Antonio River falls approximately nine feet from Brackenridge Park and the Pearl Brewery to downtown.

In order to allow boat travel from Downtown up to the Pearl, engineers devised a lock and dam system into the River Improvements Project. Via the AT&T Lock & Dam, river barges are raised and lowered to allow for unimpeded traffic up and down the river. The lock was designed to raise and lower boats between varying elevations along the river... similar to locks navigated by vessels on the Erie Canal.

Comfortable walking shoes and clothes are encouraged. Full Barge tour is \$320 or \$16 added to each person for the tour if we hit the max attendance of 20 people.

Webinar: Navigating the Surplus Land Act

Presenter: Austin Cho, Downey Brand LLP

In an effort to increase opportunities for development of affordable housing and open spaces in California, Assembly Bill 1486 (Ting, 2019) ushered in a host of new procedural requirements local agencies must follow prior to selling or leasing real property under the Surplus Land Act. These new requirements include formal findings declaring the land as surplus, issuing notices of availability to interested housing sponsors and other public agencies with jurisdiction over the land, engaging in a mandatory good faith negotiations, and apprising the California Department of Housing and Community Development ("HCD") of all the steps taken along the way. The amendments to the Surplus Land Act also bestow upon HCD expanded enforcement powers and impose penalties for local agencies that fail to comply.

Despite HCD's issuance of guidelines earlier in 2021, navigating the procedural and substantive requirements of the Surplus Land Act remains a challenge for many local agencies, including special districts. This webinar will provide an overview of the requirements governing the disposition of agencyowned real property and identify the key exceptions

Webinar: AB 1234 Training: Ethics Training

AB 1234 requires new elected officials to receive ethics training within a year of assuming office, and existing elected officials to receive ethics training every two years while in office. For officials who have attended multiple AB1234 training sessions, this training often can become repetitive and unexciting. This session will provide AB 1234 training in the context of a mock city council meeting, presenting scenarios that will bring meaning to the conflict of interest, Brown Act, fair process, and other ethics principles required by AB 1234. In this two part (two-hour) training, we will cover all required topics, including California ethics laws relating to (1) financial and other disqualifying conflicts of interest by public officials, (2) acceptance of gifts, travel, or discounted transportation, and use of public resources for personal or political purposes, (3) transparency laws relating to disclosure of personal financial interests (Form 700s) and open meeting laws regarding disclosure and recusal, and (4) fair process (incompatible offices, competitive bidding, and nepotism).

Webinar: Sexual Harassment Prevention for Non-Supervisors

Under Senate Bill 1343, passed in 2018, California employers with five or more employees must provide at least 1 hour of training and education regarding sexual harassment, abusive conduct and harassment based on gender to all employees within 6 months of their assuming their role, and every 2 years after. This training must be provided by January. 1, 2021.

SB 1343 also includes temporary and seasonal employees, who must be trained within 30 days of their hiring or 100 hours worked, whichever is first. This training must be consistent with what is provided to other employees. The requirement for seasonal and temporary workers began on January 1, 2020.

This training, via webinar, will satisfy SB 1343 requirements. The webinar is interactive, allowing attendees to ask questions.



The CalTRECS clearinghouse provides SSN lookup and validation function, an automated voice response system for debtor queries, a helpline for technical assistance to the agencies, and modification of the FTB reconciliation files for ease of use.

Most Districts are not aware of this one-time opportunity, which hasn't been available in the last 40 years, and won't be available after March 2021. By properly analyzing detailed interval data for each account, customers can identify which accounts will benefit from rate changes, and more importantly, precisely when the changes should be made to maximize savings. While these savings are short-term (i.e., only through March 2021), they can be substantial. Utility Cost Management LLC (UCM) will discuss how Districts can obtain these savings by analyzing and implementing the available options.

Performance Management: A Change Agent

Performance Management shouldn't be a one-size-fits-all approach; in fact, it can look different for each agency, and possibly even each department, depending on the size and desired accomplishments of an organization. It is important for an organization to choose Performance Management program elements that make the most sense to its organizational culture and operations. Program elements such as coaching, mentoring, formal reviews, core competencies, and even disciplinary action, are potential components which may be combined for a customized Performance Management program. At its core, the performance evaluation process should be based on the following principles: (1) a focus on career development and coaching vs. a focus on weaknesses, reprimands, or discipline; (2) performance goal setting and evaluation, which are two-way processes involving both the employee and manager; and (3) performance is evaluated on objective, job-related criteria that have been communicated to the employee in advance.

SB1383 Reducing Short-Lived Climate Pollutants in CA
