Recommendation:

Staff and the Personnel Committee recommend the Board approve moving the Purchasing Technicians into the Finance Department with an updated job description.

Alternative Options:

The alternative is to leave these positions in the Facilities Department.

Background:

Historically, the District has had two Purchasing Technicians in the Facilities Department. These technicians stock and supply the District's warehouse with all necessary inventory along with making sure that our crews have necessary equipment and supplies for projects. They also order and research supplies for the other departments in the District. Since this a support function for multiple departments, the District is recommending moving them into the Finance Department. This will also allow for easier fiscal tracking.

PURCHASING TECHNICIAN

FLSA Status: Non-Exempt

DEFINITION

To plan and organize the District's warehouse and service functions and functions associated with receiving, warehousing, and distribution of supplies, parts, and equipment; to establish and manage procurement, inventory control and warehousing systems; and to do related work as required.

Ensures that the District has or can get the materials necessary to keep the water system functioning properly. This position is also responsible for satisfying the supply needs of various District departments.

SUPERVISION RECEIVED AND EXERCISED

Receives supervision from the Accounting Supervisor.

EXAMPLES OF ESSENTIAL DUTIES - Duties may include, but are not limited to, the following:

Receiving Functions:

Receive materials and supplies at the District's warehouse; inspect shipments for damage and conformance to invoice, and packing list; offload and store materials received using forklift or other equipment; return defective materials; notify and /or deliver to appropriate persons when shipments are received.

Establishes and oversees an inventory control system for materials, supplies, parts, all small equipment required for the efficient operation of the District.

Develops procedures for the requisition, acquisition, warehousing, and distribution of supplies and equipment.

Contacts vendors regarding prices, discounts, product availability, deliveries and product problems.

Issues and delivers materials, equipment and supplies.

Load, unload, assemble and deliver requested materials from warehouse to offices and job sites.

Maintains current information on trends and practices in public purchasing.

Maintains shipping/receiving and other records of materials in the warehouse and enter data into computerized inventory control data base as needed.

Assist in purchasing a variety of routine and non-routine items; contact vendors concerning price and availability of materials, parts, and equipment; solicit informal bids and quotes and select of recommend vendor selection; place approved orders with vendors.

Participate in all phases of District-wide activities and operations as assigned, including after-hours, on-call, and at other unusual times.

Assists other District personnel in all phases of activities and operations as needed, including after-hours, on-call, and at other unusual times.

Service and Warehouse Functions:

Plans and organizes the receiving, warehousing, and distribution of District supplies, parts, and equipment.

Plans, organizes, and documents all small meter, angle stop and meter box repair/replacement programs.

Establish and maintain proper inventory levels through use of a computerized inventory system which includes inventory related to emergency preparedness.

Reviews invoice of asphalt cuts, ensures accuracy, and submits for payment when completed.

Enters and updates material cost data and inventory levels onto computer.

Verify the accuracy of shipments, and report problems and discrepancies to District management.

Operates warehouse equipment in connection with the receipt, storage, and issue of materials.

Reviews requisitions and issue ordered materials.

Conducts periodic inventories of warehouse stock; including end-of-year inventory count and balancing to general ledger.

Operates a vehicle to pick-up items purchased and deliver materials and equipment to field personnel as requested.

Cleans and organizes the warehouse and facility yards, keeping all materials properly stored and organized for systematic distribution.

Monitors the yard security gate.

Utilize the District's procurement system for bid/purchase processing as necessary..

Recommendation:

Staff recommends that the Board authorize staff to enter into a contract with the United States Geological Survey (USGS) for the services related for measuring the amount of reservoir sedimentation, the changes in reservoir storage capacity, and the physical characteristics of the deposited sediment in Littlerock Reservoir (Reservoir) from 2021 - 2024 due to the Bobcat fire.

Alternative Options:

Do not determine the amount of sediment entering the Reservoir due to the Bobcat fire.

Impact of Taking No Action:

Not being able to quantify the impacts of the Bobcat Fire on the Littlerock Reservoir operation and the resulting additional costs to the District. This will make it more difficult to obtain State or Federal relief for the impact.

Background:

Littlerock Reservoir is located immediately downstream from the Bobcat Fire burn area (Figure 1). Wildfires increase erosion potential by removing vegetation that intercepts rainfall and by reducing soil infiltration capacity. Because the Littlerock Creek watershed contains areas of steep terrain burned during the Bobcat Fire, the potential exists for increased erosion, sediment runoff, and debris flows during post-fire rainfall events. The increased sediment runoff will flow into and deposit within Littlerock Reservoir, reducing its storage capacity. Measurements of the amount of sedimentation are needed to inform Reservoir operations and already planned sediment maintenance activities. Because the effects of wildfires can persist for multiple years post-fire, and are dependent on hydrologic conditions, a 4-year timeframe is proposed for the monitoring program writing of the final report and article.

The study objectives are to measure the amount of Reservoir sedimentation, the changes in Reservoir storage capacity, and the physical characteristics of the deposited sediment in Littlerock Reservoir from 2021 - 2024. The Study results will be documented, report provided, and published in scientific journal article.

Reservoir sedimentation and storage capacity changes will be measured by surveying the bathymetry and topography of the Reservoir annually and by incorporating pre- and postsediment removal information provided by PWD. The Reservoir will be surveyed in the spring (April/May) of each year, when the Reservoir is typically full, to document the volume of sedimentation that occurred over the winter rainy season. This survey will be conducted using multibeam sonar and lidar (for shoreline topography). Samples of the deposited sediment will be collected from the Reservoir bottom using shallow-coring techniques to document the particle sizes and organic content of the sediment. Sub-bottom profiling will also be conducted to document deposit thicknesses and acoustic properties as a complement to the bathymetry and coring data. The surveys will be processed into elevation models that will be used to compute the storage capacity of the Reservoir from the lowest elevations to the dam crest for each survey. The models will be differenced to compute the changes in storage capacity between subsequent surveys. Analyses of sedimentation rates and changes in storage capacity will also incorporate changes in topography resulting from planned sediment removal activities within the Reservoir. This information will be collected by other entities and provided to USGS by PWD. Finally, a time-lapse camera will be installed upstream of the Reservoir to document inflow conditions, and readily available satellite imagery of the Littlerock Creek watershed will be analyzed to assess the prevalence of landslides and debris flow initiation within the burn area.

This work is part of Strategic Initiative No. 1 - Water Resource Reliability, No. 3 - Systems Efficiency, and No. 5 - Regional Leadership.

Wildfires increase erosion potential by removing vegetation that intercepts rainfall and by reducing soil infiltration capacity. Because the Little Rock Creek watershed contains areas of steep terrain burned during the Bobcat Fire, the potential exists for increased erosion, sediment runoff, and debris flows during post-fire rainfall events. The increased sediment runoff will flow into and deposit within Little Rock Reservoir, reducing reservoir storage capacity. Measurements of the amount of sedimentation are needed to inform reservoir operations and maintenance dredging activities. Because the effects of wildfires can persist for multiple years post-fire, and are dependent on hydrologic conditions, a 3-year timeframe is proposed for the monitoring program.

Objectives: The primary objectives of the study are to measure the amount of reservoir sedimentation, the changes in reservoir storage capacity, and the physical characteristics of the deposited sediment, in Little Rock Reservoir from 2021 - 2024.

Approach: Reservoir sedimentation and storage capacity changes will be measured by surveying the bathymetry and topography of the reservoir annually and by incorporating pre- and postsediment removal (dredging) information provided by PWD. The reservoir will be surveyed in the spring (April/May) of each year, when the reservoir is full, to document the volume of sedimentation that occurred over the winter rainy season. This survey will be conducted from a boat using multibeam sonar and lidar (for shoreline topography). Samples of the deposited sediment will be collected from the reservoir bottom using shallow-coring techniques to document the particle sizes and organic content of the sediment. Sub-bottom profiling will also be conducted to document deposit thicknesses and acoustic properties as a complement to the bathymetry and coring data. The surveys will be processed into Digital Elevation Models (DEM) of the reservoir, and the DEMs will be used to compute the storage capacity of the reservoir from the lowest elevations to the dam crest for each survey. The DEMs will be differenced to compute the changes in storage capacity between subsequent surveys. Analyses of sedimentation rates and changes in storage capacity will also incorporate changes in topography resulting from planned sediment removal activities within the reservoir. This information will be collected by other entities and provided to USGS by PWD. Finally, a time-lapse camera will be installed upstream of reservoir to document inflow conditions and readily available satellite imagery of the Rock Creek watershed will be analyzed to assess the prevalence of landslides and debris flow initiation within the burn area.

Anticipated products: Study results will be documented in a USGS Scientific Investigations Report or peer-reviewed scientific journal article. Data products will be released to the public through the ScienceBase Catalog (<u>https://www.sciencebase.gov/catalog/</u>).

4.06.3 TREASURER

Dollars and Sense: The Costs of COVID and the Quest to Maintain Affordability

Even before the pandemic triggered the most severe economic downturn since the Great Depression, the affordability of our water system investments and essential utility services was a top of mind consideration for policymakers, agencies, and communities. Now, with declining public revenues and millions of California households feeling the economic crunch, the challenge of re-investing in our water system without cost-burdening the public and ratepayers has intensified in scope and complexity. How can we smartly pay for large, systemwide improvements while containing costs and keeping rates low?

Fighting Fire with Fire: Controlled Burns, Watershed Management, & Big Science

As California forests, grasslands, and communities continue to be scorched by devasting wildfires, our attention must shift to our watersheds where many of these conflagrations begin.

Dead, dry, and bunched trees and plants are not only readymade kindling for megafires, but also impediments to the health of our ecosystems and water supply. What more must be done in our forested spaces to reduce the risk of wildfire and improve the condition of our watersheds?

Keeping Our Ear to the Ground: Where Do We Stand on SGMA?

Any road to resiliency will require the sustainable management of California's groundwater resources. And after several years of implementing the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA), newly formed Groundwater Sustainability Agencies have begun to deploy their plans to manage medium and high-priority basins. What have locals learned as they operationalize groundwater management regimes, and what more must be done to set us on the path to sustainability?

Where Regulations Collide - How Do We Harmonize Inter-Agency Workflow?

California has a proud track record of prioritizing public welfare and environmental stewardship, a commitment requiring thoughtful rules and well-staffed agencies to execute our ambitious plans. However, with a hearty bureaucracy comes the potential for disharmony between different state agencies as each work to deliver considered but sometimes conflicting objectives. What steps can be taken to better align overlapping rules, agency priorities, and regulatory processes as we work to enhance the resiliency of our water system?

Under Senate Bill 1343, passed in 2018, California employers with five or more employees must provide at least 1 hour of training and education regarding sexual harassment, abusive conduct and harassment based on gender to all employees within 6 months of their assuming their role, and every 2 years after. This training must be provided by Jan. 1, 2021.

SB 1343 also includes temporary and seasonal employees, who must be trained within 30 days of their hiring or 100 hours worked, whichever is first. This training must be consistent with what is provided to other employees. The requirement for seasonal and temporary workers began on Jan. 1, 2020.

This training, via webinar, will satisfy SB 1343 requirements. The webinar is interactive, allowing attendees to ask questions.

This session will bring together experts with experience designing/operating mobile water treatment units that leverage membrane treatment processes. While many municipal water treatment plants employ processes optimized by substantial raw water quality data and extensive pilot testing, mobile water treatment systems must be designed to rapidly treat water from a wide range of sources, regardless of the contamination level. Often, the operators of mobile systems do not have access to extensive analytical capability to assess whether the produced water is free from biological and chemical contamination or the time to send samples back to the lab for extensive water quality testing. In these situations, the operator/public health officials must rely on a "multiple barrier approach" where the treatment system is designed with redundancy by providing total treatment efficacy using a combination of processes such as membrane pretreatment (MF/UF), reverse osmosis (RO), and disinfection. They rely on process parameters that can be easily field verified by real-time monitoring such as: pressure integrity, TDS rejection, and chlorine residual. These redundant measures ultimately provide water that is safe to drink. During this session, representatives from academia, the US Army, the US Army Corps of Engineers, and the US Bureau of Reclamation will present the science and application of their mobile systems by reviewing examples where their membrane systems have been used in the field during emergency response, site remediation, and a mobile approach to achieving high recovery desalination that is powered by renewable energy.

This webinar will provide the learner with a wider perspective of the treatment applications addressed by mobile membrane treatment units. Case studies presented during the webinar will include the US Bureau of Reclamation's Expeditionary Unit Water Purifier (used during Hurricane Katrina); the US Army Corps of Engineers' Decontamination Effluent Treatment System (including use for PFAS treatment); the US Army's Lightweight Water Purifier (emergency use treatment device for the soldier); and The University of Texas El Paso's Center for Inland Desalination Systems' mobile highrecovery renewable-powered desalination drinking and irrigation water system that has been deployed in Tegucigalpa, Honduras.

The goal of this presentation is to share and consider different perspectives on how to communicate about subjects that concern customers but about which many factors remain unknown. The presentation provides examples of how utilities have communicated about drinking water topics of emerging concern or regarding unregulated substances. Examples include utility communications about cyanotoxins in jurisdictions where no maximum contaminant levels are in place and about per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) where no regulations are in force, but lots of media and potential misinformation are in play around the topic. Talking About the Unknown also offers a general overview of communication strategies to handle unknown and emerging topics as well as COVID-19 or other unprecedented incidents. Within these discussions, the presenters will provide insight into communication strategies, communication partners, and lessons learned about what has worked well in the past.

Learners will be able to pull from other utility's experiences about how to communicate to their customers, key stakeholders, and elected officials when regulations are not available to guide the discussion or unprecedented events are occurring in their location. Lessons learned from past experiences can illustrate good practices for dealing with misinformation about contaminants of emerging concern and provide examples of helpful communication partners and practices. Available resources to support utility communications will also be highlighted in the webinar.
