6-Million-Gallon Clearwell **Tank Back in Service After Removal of Baffle Curtains**

Water in the 6-million-gallon clearwell tank on Avenue S is once again flowing to Palmdale Water District (PWD) customers following nearly a month of baffle curtain removal and cleaning and disinfecting of the tank.

Known as the 6M, the water tank no longer contains the baffle curtains that

curtains were cut by divers before the water was drained into the area's detention basins. PWD staff vacuumed and cleaned all the debris from the floor of the tank, which was later sprayed with a heavy dose of chlorine for disinfection.

"The District is pleased to have the 6M thoroughly cleaned and back to serving our customers," said PWD General Manager Dennis D. LaMoreaux. "We want to reassure everyone that all the baffle curtains were removed, and the tank was completely cleaned of debris. To accomplish this complicated task, we had to shut down the 6M and adjust our water distribution plan. We thank everyone for their patience and understanding."

During the clearwell shutdown, customers received water from PWD's 21 wells

2023 Highlights

At PWD, 2023 was another eventful year filled with positive happenings. It started with much needed storms that filled reservoirs and prompted the State Water Project to give PWD a 100% water allocation for the first time in 17 years. By mid-year, the District received the full funding of \$22.58 million from state and federal agencies to convert the century-old Palmdale Ditch into a closed pipeline. To meet more of our customers and share project news, there was a well-attended Customer Appreciation Day in the summer. Here are more highlights:



Facilities Department

The winter storms and the summer's Hurricane Hilary crushed the drought but created emergency work at various PWD sites. The crew handled projects, emergencies and basic maintenance, including:

- Exercising 959 valves
- Repairing 50 service line leaks and nine mainline leaks
- Repairing 120 air vacs
- Maintaining 280 fire hydrants

Pure Water AV

While the designing and engineering of the Pure Water AV continued, staff started familiarizing the community with PWD's upcoming water purification project. It will take recycled water through a three-step process involving intense treatment before being injected in the aquifer and later pumped for potable use. The groundbreaking of the Pure Water AV Demonstration Facility is scheduled for spring 2024.

End of Drought

In May, PWD declared an end to its emergency drought restrictions.

Community Outreach

The Water-Use Efficiency team gave lessons on the water cycle and the importance of using water wisely at six Palmdale School District campuses. More than 100 students participated in the Earth Day "Water Super Hero" contest. Dozens of community members attended Water-Wise Workshops, *Let's Talk H2O!* events and Coffee with a Director. The Public Affairs team wrapped up the year with its second straight PRism award from the Public Relations Society of America – Los Angeles Chapter.

and treated water from the Leslie O. Carter Water Treatment Plant through the three-million-gallon water tank, or 3M, that is also on Avenue S.

In late October, the State Water Resources Control Board, Division of Drinking Water asked PWD to remove the baffle curtains after debris that included pieces of the curtain was found in water being flushed from a transmission main. Baffle curtains in the 6M, which is where treated water is stored before distribution, increase contact time for chlorine-treated water by creating a longer flow path within the tank, improving water treatment performance. The 6M will operate with additional controls to get the same performance until new baffle curtains are installed.

According to LaMoreaux, the baffle curtains were from the late 1990s. The curtain material is Hypalon, which does not dissolve and is safe to be in contact with drinking water, per the National Science Foundation.

As required by the state, PWD publishes an annual Consumer Confidence Report that provides detailed information about its water quality. In 2022, PWD completed more than 18,000 tests for 80 regulated contaminants. The report is available in English and Spanish on the PWD website at www.palmdalewater.org.

A: Apply for the variance and the RAP, if eligible. Both can help with your monthly bill.


