## Helpful Hints for Your Yard this

- Water up to four days a week
- Use three short cycles per watering day to prevent runoff
- Run each sprinkler station for about five minutes per cycle
- Aim for a total of 15 minutes per day, 60 minutes per week
- Inspect sprinkler heads regularly to avoid leaks and overspray

### Customer Care Corner

Ask Customer Care Rep Angel Salmeron

- What's the best time of day to water my lawn during the summer?
- The most efficient time to water is early in the morning or after sunset. This reduces water loss through evaporation and wind. PWD recommends watering before 10 a.m. or after 6p.m. to save water and improve absorption.
- How can I tell if my sprinklers are wasting water?
- Check regularly to ensure water is not spraying onto sidewalks, driveways, or streets. Water pooling or flowing off your yard is a sign the sprinkler is operating too fast or too long.
- ? Do you have any simple tips to help me lower my water bill this summer?
- Reduce each sprinkler run by a minute and use multiple short cycles for better soil absorption.
  - Replace older toilets with highefficiency models and install water-saving showerheads to reduce indoor use.
  - Adding mulch to your garden beds and drought-tolerant plants can help reduce water usage.


# Congratulations to the 2025 PWD Water Ambassadors
