



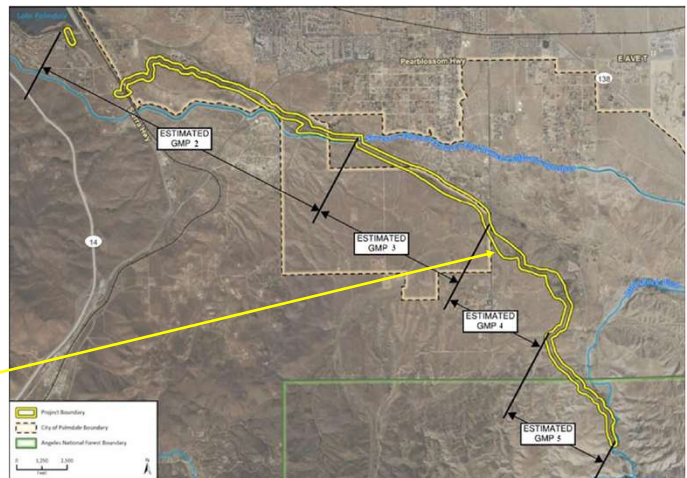
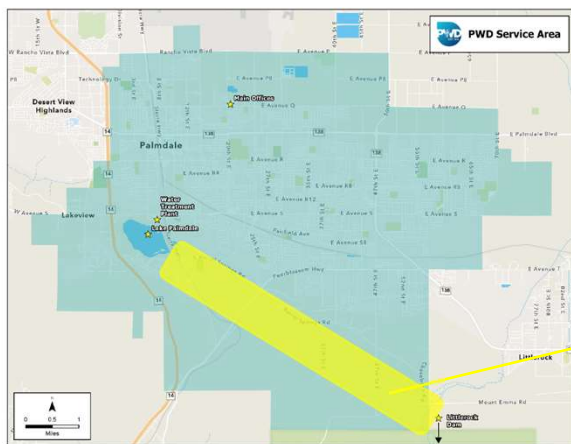

## Background and Needs

- Project requires cultural monitoring per CEQA & AB 52
- Invitations sent to three federally/state-recognized Tribes:
  - San Fernando Band of Mission Indians
  - Yuhaaviatam San Manuel Nation
  - Fernandeno Tataviam Band of Mission Indians
- Estimated ~175 working days of construction
- Rotating participation: ~60 days per Tribe

## Proposed Scope of Work

- Tribal Monitor labor for on-site monitoring.
- Daily digital documentation of work activity and any artifact discoveries through monitoring logs and photographs.
- Protective equipment and field necessities for the monitors.
- Mileage, lodging, and transportation costs.
- Clerical support for compiling records in the project archive.
- Manager oversight, including Tribal coordination, reporting, and correspondence.
