PWD BOARD TO FILL VACANT **DIVISION 5 SEAT BY APPOINTMENT; APPLICATIONS** DUE BY SEPT. 1

Palmdale, CA – After voting Monday to fill the vacant Division 5 Director position by appointment, the Palmdale Water District (PWD) Board of Directors is accepting applications until Sept. 1, 2025.

Applicants must be registered voters and reside within the boundaries of Division 5, which is an area roughly north of Highway 138 (Palmdale Boulevard) from 30th Street East to 47th Street East, east of 47th Street East to 80th Street East, and south to Avenue S.

To be considered for the position, the Division 5 Director Applicant Questionnaire must be completed and submitted by the deadline. The questionnaire and map of Division 5 are available online at https://www.palmdalewater.org/governance/board-of-directors/. It is also posted at PWD's main office at 2029 East Avenue Q, Palmdale City Library (more)

at 700 East Palmdale Blvd. and Legacy Commons for Active Seniors at 930 East Avenue Q-9.

Division 5 was previously served by Director Vincent Dino, who unexpectedly passed away on July 20. The appointee will serve the remainder of the vacated term. The seat will be up for election in November 2026.
